## Review & Study: REVELATION- PERGAMUM

- A. Memorize **Revelation 3:22**: *He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.* <sup>ESV</sup>
- B. Answer the following questions about **Revelation 2:12-17**.
1. Who were the first hand recipients of this revelation (v. 8)? Whose words are these? How is he identified? What does this title refer to (1:16)?
  2. What did Jesus know about the church in Pergamum according to the first sentence of verse 13? What does he mean by this? What is this church then commended for? What do you think the time described here was like for this church?
  3. According to verse 14, what did Jesus have against the Pergamum church? What is the teaching of Balaam and why was it so bad for the Israelites? What might this have looked like in this church?
  4. What likely was the teaching of the Nicolaitans that this church allowed some to follow (v. 15)?
  5. What then did Jesus call these believers to do according to verse 16 and what does this mean? What did he say would happen if they did not do this?
  6. What does verse 17 call for? Who would have such ears to hear? What promise is given? What does it mean?
- C. Answer the following questions about **2 Peter 2:15-16**.
1. What more do we learn about the teaching of Balaam in this passage?
  2. What then is the “right way” and what is the wrong?
- D. Answer the following questions about **Roman 6:15-16**.
1. What do these verses say about the freedom that Christians have to sin without condemnation because we are under grace?
  2. To be clear, what will presenting ourselves to be ruled by sin do?
- E. Answer the following questions about **Hebrews 4:12-13**.
1. How does verse 12 describe the Word of God? What does this mean and how does God’s word do this?
  2. What does God see and what should this mean for us?
- F. Application
1. Can you identify areas of your life where you tend to compromise?
  2. In ways do you find yourself enslaved to sin? Take time to tell God.
