1. What does this passage say about the source of Scripture (v. 16)?
  2. What does it then say about how we can use Scripture?
- E. Answer the following questions about **Hebrews 6:17-20**.
1. What does this passage say about the character of God?
  2. What do these truths mean then, for anything that God says?
- F. Answer the following questions about **Matthew 5:17-19**.
1. What did Jesus not come to do (v. 17)? Why then did he come?
  2. What did Jesus say about scripture (v. 18)? What does it mean?
- G. Answer the following questions about **Revelation 22:18-19**.
1. What does this say about adding to and taking away from Scripture?
  2. What does this mean for the current form of Scripture?
- H. Answer the following questions about **Psalms 119:30**.
1. What does this Psalm say about the word of God?
  2. What does this mean for our ability to comprehend Scripture?
